Hello Somersham.

Following the Parish Councils tree survey, two trees were identified as "needing to be felled" after being subject to a resistograph survey. This will take place as and when the rules allow.

At the lake the new teaching platform has been built and the duck feeding platform has been repaired. Both make a lovely addition to the lake area.

The extension to the Norwood car park has hit a roadblock but the re-lining of the car park and the installation of the EV charging points are ongoing. Hopefully by the time you receive this Newsletter both should be completed.

The damaged bench at West End will be replaced and the bench at Parkhall Road will have new timber fitted.

There has also been a new defibrillator installed on the Millennium Field gates. **This can be used on children.**

The Neighbourhood plan is gradually taking shape under the guidance of our Executive officer. Watch this space.

Unfortunately, the Connections Youth bus is again having mechanical problems and as such will not be back with us until 2025. We will keep you posted through this Newsletter, village notice boards, our Facebook page and Word press.

On This Day.....

15 Oct 1666 Samuel Pepys recorded in his diary that Charles II had started wearing the first known waistcoat. The King was so overweight that he left the bottom button undone, a fashion custom followed to this day,

7 Sep 1838 Grace Darling and her father rescued the crew of the Forfarshire, a steamer wrecked off the Northumberland coast, close to the Longstone Lighthouse. She became a national heroine.

3 Oct 1906 SOS became the international distress signal, replacing the call sign CDQ, sometimes explained as 'Come Damn Quick!'

8 Oct 1908 The Wind In The Willows, Kenneth Grahame's classic children's book, was published. It has never been out of print in its entire history.





23 Nov 1963 The BBC broadcast the first ever episode of Doctor Who, starring William Hartnell as the Doctor, and Ann Ford as his first female companion. It is the world's longest running science fiction drama. The producer, Sydney Newman, thought the Daleks, designed by Ray Cusick, were 'bug-eyed monsters' and totally wrong for the series.

6 Nov 1975 UK punk rock group, the Sex Pistols, gave their first public performance at London's St Martin's College of Art. College authorities cut the concert short after a mere 10 minutes.



After last year's bird flu outbreak we lost nearly all the Common Terns nesting on the lake, we held our breaths to see if any would return to breed this year. Thankfully one pair returned and successfully raised two chicks, hopefully this means the colony will continue to establish itself again in the coming years, fingers crossed.

We had two well attended bat walks on the reserve and a new species for the reserve was detected, a Nathusius's pipistrelle. We had a lovely day for our butterfly and insect walk, although butterfly and insect numbers seem to be down this year, possibly due to the unseasonably wet spring. Now we look forward to the autumn and winter months, with Lake Fun Day, Apple Day and a fungi foray. The autumn is also the start of the work parties that are held on the first Sunday of each month from September to March. See you on the nature reserve.

DUE TO CIRCUMSTANCES BEYOND OUR CONTROL THE ANTICIPATED RETURN OF THE YOUTH BUS IN SEPTEMBER HAS BEEN DELAYED UNTIL 2025.



The bus has proved to be very popular with the children in the village, but unfortunately at the present time we have been unsuccessful in finding an alternative option. We will continue with our efforts over the next months.

There have been 10 sessions run this term and the number of children attending each week has gradually increased from five to twenty one. The Youth workers submit a termly report to the Parish Council, here are a few from last term:

22 Apr (**7 attending**) Enjoyed good game of football outside then popcorn and tile decorating and game of What the Meme. Conversations about school, teachers, Formula 1,exclusions and football.

29 Apr (8) Enjoyed trying out circus equipment and balloon modelling. Also football, tag, FIFA and quiz. Conversations about knives, school, holiday, parents and theme parks.

13 May (9) Warm evening enjoying football outside, completing surveys, Uno and listening to music. Conversations about football, mental health, school, PE teacher and careers.

20 May (12) More new members made session livelier and fun. Long game of football outside plus some crafts, quiz and chatting inside. Conversations about new bus equipment, school, teachers not caring, half-term plans, bus passes

10 Jun (21) More new members. Enjoyed doing quiz, bead making, dancing and singing along to music, frisbee, football and Uno. Conversations about relationships, lost phones (phishing), possibly changing schools, school bus services and social media use.

Somersham Angling Club

Somersham angling club came into a new management team in 2018, volunteers from the village approached the Parish Council to seek permission to revamp the forgotten club and attempt to move it into a recognisable, successful angling club for the village to enjoy.

Six years on we now have a thriving club envied by many anglers and clubs alike from surrounding areas.

Working in partnership with the local nature reserve group we have successfully transformed the lake from a dumping ground into the beautiful asset that all the village can enjoy today whether your an angler or just an outdoor enthusiast.

In the past 6 years we have landed various grants of over 17k to install new family friendly fishing platforms, Bankside planting, bird nesting facilities including a kingfisher nesting box, picnic benches and the aeration system along with many other facilities.

The lake holds a healthy stock of fish including carp, tench, bream, roach, rudd and many more.

We also host events on the lake, many fishing matches are arranged with local clubs along with

Junior fishing activities including the annual cubs/beavers evening of litter picking, fishing and BBQ and our biggest success the

Lake Funday where anyone can try their hand for the 1st time at catching a fish,
last year this event was attended by over 300 people!!

The club and Nature Reserve Group rely on volunteer hours to keep the lake and its surroundings in tip top shape.

Watch and report any sightings of Asian hornets this summer

The government is urging <u>UK beekeepers and the public to be increasingly vigilant to the presence of Asian hornet and report any sightings.</u>

Asian hornets are distinctive and can be identified by their very dark body, wide orange stripe on the fourth abdomen section and yellow leg ends.

If individuals suspect they have seen an Asian hornet, they should report this using the app 'Asian Hornet Watch' or by using this <u>online report form</u>.



Alternatively, they can e-mail <u>alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk</u> and include a photograph if the individual can safely obtain one.
