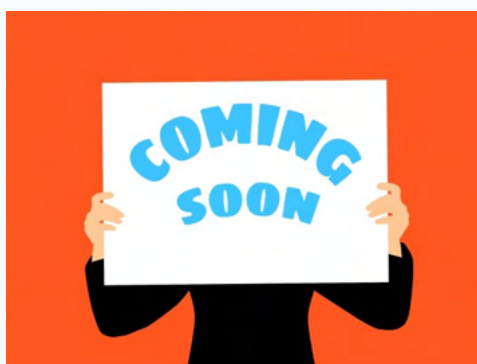

In an attempt to moderate serious and persistent speeding along some residential roads in your village – including yours – the Parish Council, with the support of the Constabulary, is seeking to facilitate the formation of a Police-managed, trained and supported

Community Speedwatch (CSW) Team

To passively educate speeding drivers using Speed Indicating Devices and Advisory Letters

A CSW Team has to comprise at least 3 people kerbside to manage the workload at hotspots during sessions up to an hour long. For sessions to be regular we need 5/6 volunteers with one acting as the XL (.csv) Coordinator. Sessions will be at your convenience and always in daylight hours. Full training is provided by the appointed Force CSW Officer. Can you manage something like that once a month (say), near your house or even elsewhere in your village – everywhere needs help?

Somersham Nature Reserve - Nature News February 2024

The winter months are always the busiest on the nature reserve, being the best time for carrying out all our habitat management and maintenance work. This time of year is when nature is dormant and we cause the least amount of disturbance to it. Tasks for the winter have included cutting back unsafe trees including several large willow trees, clearing path side vegetation to make access easier and cutting and raking the wildflower areas to favour the flowering plants loved by butterflies and insects.

Our work parties are held on the first Sunday of the month between September and March. We start at 9.30 and finish at 12.30, meeting at the 'containers' off Springfield'. No experience is needed, and all tools are provided. You don't have to stay for the whole session, even an hour, would be greatly appreciated and would help to make a big difference to the management of our wonderful nature reserve.

This year we are returning to a full events programme. Many of these are joint events with the Timebank and Angling Club and include:

Sunday 12 May: Dawn Chorus Walk. Meet at the Station Approach entrance to the Nature Reserve at 4.30am to experience a feast of sounds to the ears. Followed by a breakfast feast just off the reserve.

Saturday 25 May: Bat Walk. Meet at the Station Approach entrance to the Nature Reserve at 9pm to see and hear some of the nocturnal residents of the nature reserve.

Saturday 20 July: Butterfly and Insect Walk. Meet at the Springfields entrance to the Nature Reserve at 10am for a walk to meet some of the smaller, 6 legged creatures that make the reserve their home.

Saturday 10 August: Bat Walk. If you missed the Bat walk earlier in the year, another chance to see and hear them. Meet at the Station Approach entrance to the Nature Reserve at 8.30pm

Saturday 7 September: Lake Fun Day. Join the Somersham Nature Reserve Group, Somersham Angling Club and Timebank for a day of fun around the lake and nature reserve. More details in the next issue of Somersham 4 U.

Sunday 13 October: Apple Day at the Orchard. Join Timebank and Somersham Nature Reserve Group for the annual celebration of all matters apple related. More details in the next issue of Somersham 4 U.

On This Day.....

25 Apr 1719 Robinson Crusoe first appeared in paperback. Written by Daniel Defoe it was based partly on the story of Alexander Selkirk who was marooned on a Pacific island for four years.

10 Apr 1912 The British built luxury liner Titanic set sail on its maiden and only voyage, from Berth 44, White Star Line dock, Southampton, bound for New York.

16 Apr 1912 American Harriet Quimby became the first woman to fly an airplane across the English Channel. She took off from Dover, en route to Calais, France and made the flight in 59 minutes, landing about 25 miles from Calais, on a beach. Although Quimby died at the age of thirty-seven (in an aeroplane accident), she had a major influence upon the role of women in aviation.

3 May 1968 The first heart transplant in Britain was carried out at the National Heart Hospital in Marylebone, London. It was undertaken on an unnamed 45-year-old man.

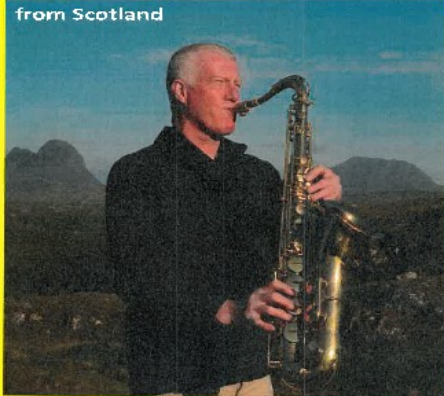

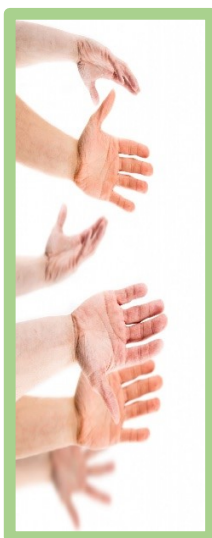

Somersham Parish Council Christmas Panto with a sprinkle of magic

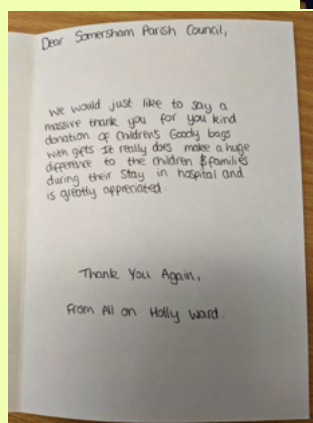


What a fabulous time was had by all at Somersham Parish Councils Christmas Pantomime and magic show on Sat 16th Dec at the Victory Hall.

Mothers' Union (Mini-Mum) meets 1st Wednesday of the month after communion.

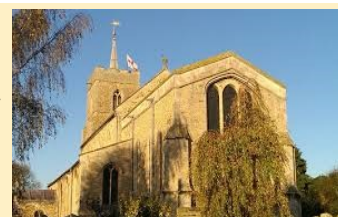
Creative Minds – Coffee and mindful activity/crafts every 3rd Wed 2.30-4.30 in church.

Fires in Somersham

Many disastrous fires have occurred at different times in Somersham's history.



In 1815 an alarming fire which threatened the destruction of the town broke out in the centre of Somersham. *Yes – Somersham was regarded as a town at that time.* Every effort was used to stop the progress of the flames and all those efforts would have been of no avail had not the wind changed direction and the fire was brought under control. However, 24 houses, many barns full of corn and several stacks of hay were at one time in flames, some reduced to ash. Few of the thirty-four people who suffered from this sad catastrophe saved anything of what they once possessed, and some nothing but the clothes they had on. There were a number of private subscriptions as well as donations from the inhabitants of neighbouring towns and villages sent to the relief committee at Somersham. The collecting sheets sent in by these places, which contain the names of the subscribers are still preserved. The total amount raised was £1244 15s 7d.

On 21st March 1855 there was a fire in which seventeen families were burnt out of their homes and several farm buildings were destroyed. In 1857 a group of four cottages and a public house near the centre of the village were totally destroyed in a fire. The most notorious fire in Somersham occurred on 26th May 1824. It involved a young man named Thomas Savage, who was only 21 years old. Savage and two other men named Woods and Cook, arranged to burn down a barn in order that they might steal something.

On the evening of the fire Cook accompanied Savage to the barn. They were there until one o'clock in the morning when Savage set fire to the thatch of the barn with Cook looking on. The building was soon ablaze and the flames quickly spread to all the buildings between the barn and a house which was entirely destroyed. The men were caught and tried at Huntingdon Assizes. Cook and Woods turned King's evidence against Savage, who pleaded guilty and received a sentence of death.

A certain amount of historical interest is attached to this fire, as Savage was the last person to be executed for incendiaryism (arson) in Huntingdonshire. His remains were buried in Somersham churchyard on the 19th December and this is recorded in the Church Burial Register. The grave is not marked, and it is said that Savage's ghost still haunts his former home which now forms part of the Windmill Public House.

Incidentally the fire engine was, at that time, kept in the lower part of the Church Tower. It would have probably just been a truck carrying firefighting apparatus and water. The fire engine was then removed to a position in an engine-house in Church Street near the north-eastern entrance to the churchyard. This building was known as the 'lock-up' because at the far end of it there was a section where people could be imprisoned for a brief period before being taken to Huntingdon. The "lock-up" was removed in 1950.
