## **Chairman's Report**

I hope you all had a nice Christmas and are enjoying a Happy New Year. Once again, our thanks go out to the "Christmas Lights" working party for their efforts in lighting up the village, and of course to all those who made an effort in their own homes and gardens.

I am sad to report that we are now down to nine councillors – to be able to hold a Parish Council meeting and get business done we require a minimum of 5 councillors present.

So, if you want to see what goes on and have a say in making important decisions, please contact the executive officer at the parish office for further information.

This year marks the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of VE day (Victory in Europe) on the 8<sup>th</sup> May 2025, which is a Thursday. Unfortunately, there is currently no national holiday or funding available for parties etc. However, the Somersham Town Band will be playing war time songs at The Cross from 6pm to 7pm on the evening so come along and hear them play !

Work is progressing with the 'Repair Café' at the Millennium Pavilion, with the foundations now laid. This has been a long ongoing project, but we have stuck with it and jumped through all the hoops as required. All credit must go to Parish Council staff for hanging in there and knocking down obstacles as they cropped up. There are a lot of changes happening in the next 2/3 years regarding the County and District Councils and the way in which they are run.

## Why become a councillor?

If you've never been to a parish council meeting before, you may be forgiven for thinking that parish councillors are a group of people who meet now and then in a draughty village hall. If however you live in a community where something 'big' has happened, you'll know that when people in the community need support and guidance, it is sometimes the parish council that they turn to.

### Why don't you make a difference !?

### Am I eligible to be a Parish Councillor?

To stand for election on a parish council, you must:

- Be a UK or commonwealth citizen, or;
- Be a citizen of the Republic or Ireland, or;
- Be at least 18 years old

To be eligible to stand for an election for a particular parish, you must:

- Be an elector of the parish, or;
- For the whole 12 months have occupied (as owner or tenant) land or other premises in the parish, or;
- During the previous 12 months have worked in the parish (as your principal or only place of work), or;
- For the whole previous 12 months lived in the parish or within three miles of the parish boundary

## Now is your opportunity to voice your opinion on how Somersham should develop over the next 15 years.

You may have seen in the Somersham 4U before Christmas that we are developing a Neighbourhood Plan. This will become a key planning document owned by everyone, and once adopted will influence the future type, scale and location of any new development in the parish. It will also help us to protect important green spaces and direct environmental improvements within the parish. The Neighbourhood Plan will contain planning policies, such as the mix of housing needed, design principles for new development, and priorities for infrastructure improvements. It will be used by Huntingdon District Council to help decide on all future planning applications in the parish.

There will be plenty of opportunities to input into the plan's development and this is the first stage. We are running a consultation throughout March, which includes a survey that asks you about a range of topics important to residents, including how you think we need to influence future planning applications.

## Somersham Primary School

Happy New Year from all at Somersham Primary School!

The autumn term was a busy one for our children and staff, with lots of exciting learning taking place and enrichment opportunities to be enjoyed. We currently have 303 children on roll and so there is always something happening!

#### <u>Reception</u>

We welcomed 50 new Reception children in September and they have settled brilliantly to the routines and systems of school life. The progress they are making is fantastic: they have already mastered a huge range of sounds and are applying this to their reading and writing. They attend Forest School sessions every Wednesday, and have completed a 'Balance ability' programme which involves them developing their balance skills on specially adapted bikes. The children enjoyed a visit from 'Little City', a roleplay experience which enables the children to dress up and interact as different members of the community, and have been on a walk round the village to identify key features. It certainly seems like they have been at school a lot longer than six months!

#### Key Stage One

Children in Key Stage One wowed the school at the end of last term with a wonderful nativity performance: 'The Fleece Force'. They rehearsed with dedication and put on a show with great confidence and engagement. They looked fantastic in their costumes! They managed to balance the demands of putting together a production with keeping up with their curriculum, learning lots about life around the UK in geography and changes in living memory in history.

#### Key Stage Two

The older children in school have also had a productive term. Learning topics linked to World War II, biomes, Roman Britain and North America have all been explored in great detail, with children producing some excellent responses in a variety of ways. Children in Year 5 and 6 experienced life as a World War II evacuee in a trip to Stibbington and really learnt a great deal from this important area of learning. Lots of children have represented the school positively in a variety of sporting events, and later this term we look forward to our choir singing at Young Voices in Birmingham and a group of Year 6 children participating in the final of the county's English Challenge.



7 Apr 1827 Chemist John Walker of Stockton on Tees sold the world's first box of 'friction matches' that he had invented the previous year. He charged one shilling for a box of 50 matches. Each box was supplied a piece of sandpaper, folded double, through which the match had to be drawn to ignite it.



2 Mar 1882 An unsuccessful attempt was made by Scotsman Roderick Maclean to assassinate Queen Victoria. As she was leaving Windsor railway station he stepped forward from the cheering crowd, lifted a revolver and fired into her carriage. Before a second shot could be fired, he was overpowered by the crowd and arrested by Superintendent Hayes. Remaining calm, the Queen and her companions rode on to Windsor Castle.

21 Apr 1932 American Amelia Earhart landed in Londonderry, Ireland, after taking off from Newfoundland the previous day. It was the world's first solo nonstop flight across the Atlantic Ocean by a female pilot.

14 Apr 1950 Comic strip hero Dan Dare, the pilot of a space ship, made his first appearance in the first edition of the comic, the Eagle. The comic merged with Lion comic in 1969. All 900,000 copies of the first issue were sold. Its founders were Mancunian Frank Hampson and an Oxford-educated vicar Marcus Morris.





6~Mar 1997 A £650,000 Picasso was stolen from a London art gallery. The thief escaped in a taxi.

4 May 2014 Science students at the University of Leicester concluded that the wooden puppet Pinocchio (who was prone to telling tales and whose nose would double in length for each lie) could only have told a maximum of 13 lies. After 13 lies it was concluded that the nose would be 140 metres long and the force exerted downwards would cause his neck to snap.

## **David Chambers BEM**

Musical Director & Conductor

We were all delighted to hear that David Chambers, Musical Director & Conductor of Somersham Town Band had been awarded the BEM in the King's New Years Honours.

Somersham Town Band was originally formed in 1919 but was disbanded in 1962. In January 1980, a group of young players from Somersham Primary School persuaded David to try to reform the band. A small number of players from the original band also returned and a concert was given in September 1980 in the Parish Church. The band continued to grow from strength to strength. David has changed the lives of several youngsters who he taught from an early age, one example is Joshua Cusworth who David started to teach when he was age 7, Joshua joined the band and since has gained a First degree at the Royal College of Music and is now a professional trumpet player and music teacher.

David has given over 45 years of dedicated unpaid leadership to the band. Congratulations to David and many thanks for being such an aspiring and amazing leader, and the band would also like to thank the people of Somersham and surrounding communities for their amazing generosity and continuing support.
